Leon Reid is a graduate of the High School of Music and Art and has received a B.M. degree in piano performance from the Manhattan School of Music. In addition he received a M.A. degree in music and music education from Teachers College/Columbia University.

He has performed recitals as a soloist and with instrumentalists and vocalists of all genres throughout the U.S., Bermuda and the West Indies, has taught music in public and private schools in N.Y., and has worked with the Boys Choir of Harlem as an associate conductor or accompanist. currently the Minister of Music at Stanwich Church in Greenwich, Connecticut and a piano instructor in greater N.Y. and Westchester County.

Born in Seoul, Korea, Miss Song immigrated to the United States with her family at the age



of fourteen, while attending high school in Atlanta, she won many statewide competitions, as well as the prestigious Kingsville International Music Competition in Texas. Miss Song earned her Bachelor of Music in piano from the Oberlin Conservatory (scholarship) and went on to receive the Superieur Concertist in performance at Centre Conservatoire in Paris under the Harriet Wooley Scholarship of the Fulbright Association. From there, she went to the Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, Hungary where she continued her post-graduate studies.

Miss Song has performed in major concert Halls in Paris, Seoul, Naples and New York, including three solo concerts at Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall. She has also given solo concerts in Italy, England, Ireland, Australia, Hungary and the United States. Her CD 'SoundDreams' was favorably reviewed by Gramophone and American record guide

and her current CD is 'Passion Remembered". Sue is the President of the Amoris Foundation where she leads a mission to bring hope to the lives of orphans and poor children through music performance education.

Her sold out concerts at the Ravello Festival in Ravello, Italy were highlights of this prestigious music festival where she performed Mozart's piano concerto #466 with the Rossini Symphony Orchestra. Sue performed several Christmas concerts for children and their families in the Amalfi coast area including Procida, Naples, Agerola, Salerno and Amalfi.

Miss Song lives in Old Greenwich Connecticut and Milan, Italy where she teaches and continues to perform and lead the mission of The Amoris Foundation (www.amorisfoundation.org), her nonprofit organization she co-founded in 2013 to "inspire hope and heal the hearts of the forgotten; hospitalized and orphaned children and the very elderly through music performance and education.
